<u>President</u> (2-year term) (vote for 1) Karen Hochberg

Karen is running for Club President. As president, Karen will work to make sure the 14WIDC endorsement and voter's guides continue to educate citizens on the best progressive candidates seeking office. She also hopes to expand the Club's influence by convening important conversations on important progressive topics. Karen will work to create a climate where new ideas are welcomed and we collaborate with other community groups to inspire people to vote and keep elected officials accountable for good government.

Karen has actively participated in the Club for many years as Secretary and recently 3rd Vice President. She is the elected Democratic Committeewoman for 14-30. Karen helped to start the Indivisible Pittsburgh Chapter and has been instrumental in planning the local March for Truth and the Women's Marches. She believes the 14WIDC has the reputation as the independent convener that interviews and conducts candidate forums, which empowers our members to endorse candidates who share our progressive values. <u>3rd Vice President</u> (1-year term due to vacancy mid-term) (vote for 1) Krysia Kubiak

I've been an attorney for 25 years and have lived in Squirrel Hill since 2009. I've worked on numerous political campaigns, starting with President Obama in 2008. I was on the Board previously, but had to step away for family reasons. I was honored to help moderate a number of debates hosted during the Barbara Daly Danko Political Forum during that time. I would like to work to help this Club continue to educate on vital issues and organize events.

<u>Secretary</u> (2-year term) (vote for 1) Mac Booker

Mac is a lawyer who lives in Squirrel Hill with his wife, Kate, and three children. He spent a number of years working in Democratic politics, both inside and outside of Pittsburgh, before attending Pitt Law. Races he worked on in Pittsburgh and surrounding areas include Pittsburgh Mayoral, Pittsburgh City Council, and Allegheny County Council. Further-flung races include races for US Senate and Governor in South Carolina and Alabama, and US Congressional races in Alabama, Michigan, and Central Pennsylvania. He also worked with the Pennsylvania League of Young Voters, as a field organizer and field director. While Mac is no longer in politics professionally, he remains active, and hopes to work with the 14th Ward Independent Democratic Club to improve governance and insure justice in Pittsburgh, as well as in Pennsylvania and the United States more generally.

Board (2-year term) (vote for up to 7)

Theresa Chalich

As a registered nurse with years of public health and mental health nursing, I have centered my clinical care and community organizing work on ensuring the accessibility and the availability of comprehensive health care. I became involved in the securing of and advocating for health care when the steel industry and its infrastructures declined in the 1980s. I was a co-founder of the Homestead Rainbow Kitchen Community Center in the early 1980s. Simultaneously, I was pursuing a Master's in Public Health at Pitt. For my master's thesis, I conducted a household survey in Homestead to determine the health care needs during this period of increased unemployment. An impact of steel job losses was that health insurance is connected to employment. No job, no health care coverage was my lightning rod for action. For me, a one seamless national health care plan to end the for-profit industry was the solution. Clinically, I founded a free health care clinic in 1991, the Rainbow Health Center that was transitioned to a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) in 1998. Politically, I extended my work with health care and advocacy-related programs and projects with the aim of organizing others to become engaged. Currently, I am pursuing Medicare for All, a national and universal health care plan, through the statewide initiative Health Care 4 All. During this Covid-19 pandemic, I actively volunteered with the Nurses of PA. This statewide group presented The Nurse Plan for PA's Recovery in the early months of the pandemic. A goal of the plan was to secure support for it and action on it from all levels of state government. Theresa is a Democratic Committee member in 14-33.

Sabina Deitrick

Sabina is a 21 year resident of the 14th ward, a 30 year resident of Pittsburgh, and long time Club member, as well as a faculty member at the University of Pittsburgh. She serves on the City of Pittsburgh Planning Commission and is a board member of the Steel Valley Authority. Sabina would be honored to serve the Club as a board member and work for the continued activism and involvement of the Club in coming elections and critical issues.

Marvin Leibowitz

I am an attorney with a downtown law practice with a focus on bankruptcy, civil litigation, criminal, law, and social security. I have been involved in progressive causes
